CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

The corner was originally established by Arthur Philbrick under mineral survey No. 546 from January 7-11 of 1904. The original notes state that at the corner a marked black pine post 3½! long by 4" square was set 18" in the ground with mound of rocks from which:

A 40" yellow pine bears S83° 10'W -44.63'. A 35" yellow pine bears S2° 35'W -75.6'. Each blazed and scribed BTA No. 1 E-C-546.

The corner was remonumented by Leland Myers in 1972.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2½" alum cap in 1" GIP protruding 18" out of mound from which:

A 34" ponderosa pine bears $S2^{10}_{20}$ W-76 $\frac{0}{1}$, healed blaze. A 40" ponderosa pine bears $S83^{0}$ W-46 $\frac{1}{1}$, with scribing visable on opened blaze.

Description of manument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

The monument set by Myers was stabilized with rock; no new bearing trees were established.

Attached signs 54-3 and 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" red ring around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence posts Northeast and Southwest of corner and attached signs 54-2 to both posts and sign 54-9 to one post.

Used steel tape and magnetic staff compass with 20° East declination measured to center of bearing trees.

This corner was maintained on July 6, 1983.
