Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 20" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone, from which:

A 17" Ponderosa Pine bears S 80° E - 47.4', scribed: NE 1/16 S13 BT.

A 11" Ponderosa Pine bears N $2\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W - 69.2', scribed: NE 1/16 S13 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Attached signs 54-3 and 54-9, and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence posts on National Forest Boundary North and East of the corner, and attached sign 54-9 to one post and sign 54-2 to both posts.

Used steel tape and staff compass with 19°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on July 8, 1986.
