
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by Horace G. Pearson, U.S. Mineral Surveyor, as part of Mineral Survey No. 508, during November, 1902. The original notes state that at the corner a 4½' long by 6" square marked tamarack post was set 18" in the ground from which:

A 20" pine bears South 7.5'. A 12" pine bears S87°30'W-15.3'. Fach marked I.-4-508 and C.P.-6-508 BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

Rotted remains of post at ground level from which:

A 15" uprooted pon. pine stump bears South - 8'+ with no remaining scribing. A rotten pon.pine stump bears S862 W-15.8' with part of blaze lying downhill from stump.

Description of monument and accessories | established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 26" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone from which:

A 10" western larch bears N76 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E-31.8' scribed 4-I-6-CP-508 BT. A 9" white fir bears S51 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E-26.4' scribed 4-I-6-CP-508 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to the face of blaze. Attached sign 54-3 and 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence post on claim line near corner and attached sign 54-9.

Used steel tape with staff compass with 20°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on October 11, 1985.
