
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established as Corner 5 of the Independence Lode, and Corner 7 of the Crown Point Lode, under MS 508, by Horace G. Pearson, U. S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, during November 1902. The original notes state that a 4' long by 4" square pine post was set 1' in the ground to bedrock with a mound of earth, marked: I5-508 and CP7-508.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a mound of earth and rotted remains of post at ground level.

Description of manument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 24" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. Placed post remains on mound. From the new monument:

A 8" White Fir bears N $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W - 6.5', scribed: 5-I-7-CP-508 BT.

A 8" White Fir bears S 60° E - 17.1', scribed: 5-I-7-CP-508 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Attached signs 54-9 and 54-3, and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence post on claim line and attached sign 54-9.

Used steel tape and staff compass with 20°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on June 4, 1986.
