Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 30" aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap, 18" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. Placed Myers monument inside the new monument. From the new monument:

A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears S $24\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W - 10.3', scribed: N 1/16 S16 BT.

A 11" Douglas Fir bears S $55\frac{1}{2}$ ° E - 22.4', scribed: N 1/16 S15 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Attached signs 54-3 and 54-9, and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree.

Set steel fence posts on National Forest Boundary North and East of corner and attached sign 54-9 to one post, and sign 54-2 to both posts.

Used steel tape and staff compass with 19°E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

This corner was remonumented on June 30, 1986.
