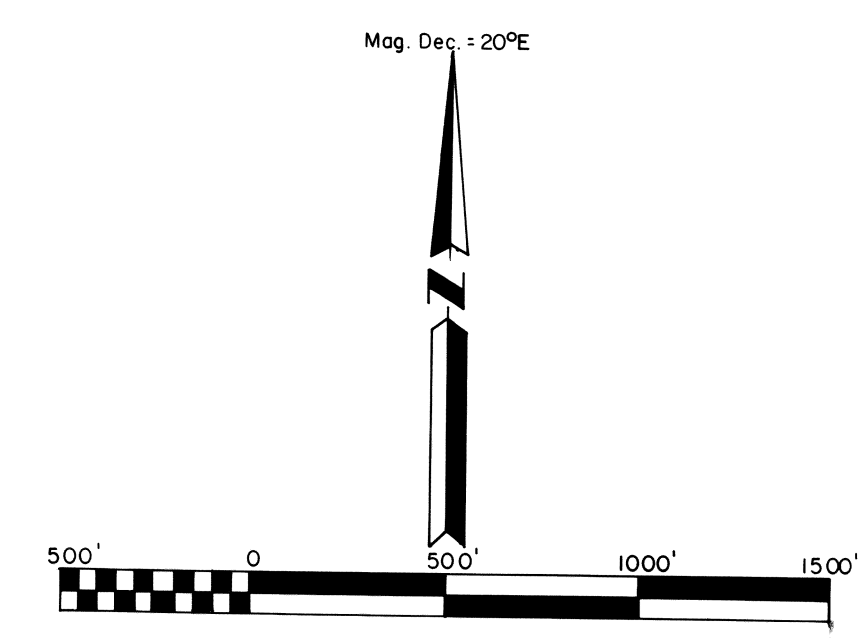
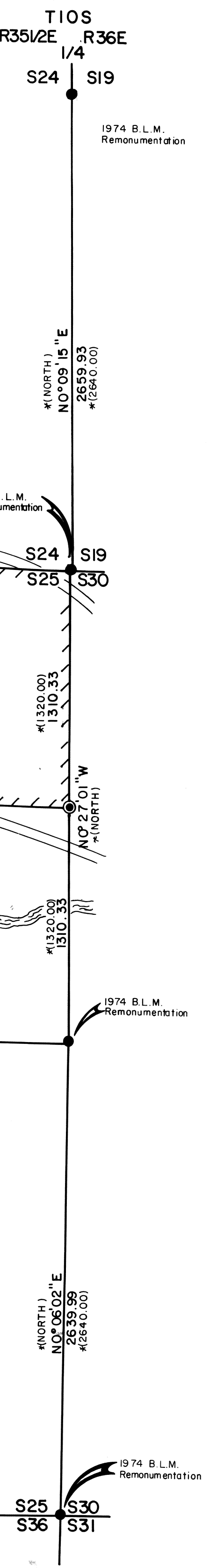

MONUMENTATION

See standard U.S.F.S. "INDEX NO.", in the circle below and on the corresponding circle on the Map left. Refer to "CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION" form, as referenced to this Map of Survey and filed in the office of the Baker County Surveyor. Those forms give complete information as to the evidence found, the method of establishment, description of monuments set & accessories established. Monumentation basically consists of the following: Monuments as shown below, with Bearing Tree signs nailed above the blaze, Warning signs nailed on the back, brass washers stamped PLS 848 nailed on the blaze above the BT scribing & painted a 6" red band around each tree. Where Bearing Trees are not available 5/8"x30" iron pins with plastic caps marked PLS 848 & guard post on the property line, each way from property corner & within 5ft. in a cardinal direction from controlling corners. Magnetic compass should be used in this area for approximations only, use true bearing for re-establishment of corners.

HISTORY

In Aug. 1881, Eugene P. McCornack, performed the original survey of the Range Line between Range 35-1/2 & 36 East, under General Land Office Contract No. 398.

In April 1884, W.B. Barr performed the original subdivisional survey of T.10 S., R.35-1/2E., under General Land Office Contract No. 492.

In 1974, the Bureau of Land Management, under special instruction dated May 3, 1957 Remonumented certain Original Corners Points, as pertinent to this survey along the East Boundary of T.10 S., R.35-1/2E.

In 1985, William R. Wells, PLS 1106, remonumented the North, South and West 1/4 Corners and the Northwest Section Corner of this Section 25, all based on original evidence recovered.

In 1988, this surveyor, Douglas M. Ferguson, PLS 848 retraced the East Boundary of T.10 S., R.35-1/2E., establishing the N1/6 S25/S30, as shown on Map of Survey No. 10-36-64, of the Baker County Survey Records. This Survey was performed for the U.S.F.S. under this same contract.

NARRATIVE

This survey is performed under contract for the Willowa Whitman National Forest, the purpose of which is the establishment and marking of the Forest Boundary as shown on this Map.

In order to perform the required subdivisions the exterior lines of Section 25 are retraced as applicable and shown on the map. All the corners as previously remonumented by the BLM in 1974, by PLS 1106, in 1985 and the N1/6 as established in 1988 by this surveyor are found.

The required subdivision is then performed in a normal manner and the required corners established and lines marked as shown on the map.

The "CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION" forms as referenced to this Map and the notes shown on the Map should be considered a substantial part of this "NARRATIVE", as they contain the detailed information as to the evaluation of evidence and monumentation work performed.

Positional control for this survey is provided by a closed traverse network. LIETZ SDM 3E, Electronic tachometer is used to obtain the measurements and HP-86B computer system is used to perform the computations. Field Notes and computations are on file in the office of "FERGUSON SURVEYING & ENGINEERING" Mt. Vernon OR.
