Found Bearing Trees as established and described by the Bureau of Land Management, with proper signs as follows: Original Bearing Tree, a Western Larch 18" dia., bears $N60^{\circ}E$., 9.2 ft. New Bearing Tree, a Ponderosa Pine 11 " dia., Bears $S67^{\circ}W$., 32.7 ft.
