## INDEX No. V-17 History of original corner establishment:

Corner was originally established in 1881, by Herman D. Gradon, under General Land Office Contract No. 416. U.S. Surveyor General's Notes State: Set a post 4 ft. long 4 ins square, 24" in the ground, for Cor. to Secs. 26,27,34 & 35 marked. T10S S26 on NE

R37E S35 on SE

\$34 on \$W and \$27 on \$NW faces, with 1 notch on \$S and 2 notches on E edges.

From which

A pine 48 ins. diam bears S80°W 237 lks. dist. marked T10S R36E S34 BT A pine 44 ins. diam bears N70°W 185 lks. dist. marked T10S R36E S27 BT No other trees within limits and raised a mound of stone alongside.

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found a mound of stone. PLS 645 J.Hambilton states that in 1966, the remains of both trees are here and the mound is in the proper position, in relation to the trees.

Found the remains of a stump, which has been cut off at ground level N67 W (Mag Compass with 20 East Dec.)., 123.0 ft. from the center of the mound of stone. [Record N70 W., 122.1 ft.] The other Tree falls in the road bed of Hwy. 7.

The Position of the center of the above described stone mound conforms to surrounding measurements and is therefore accepted as the Section Corner.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set 2-1/2"x30" aluminum pipe with 3-1/2" aluminum cap, stamped as shown on the **DIAGRAM**, SET 16" in the ground and reconstructed the stone mound around the pipe.

Ponderosa Pine 20" dia., Bears N81 0 36'W., 142.8ft., scribed: T108 R36E S27 BT Ponderosa Pine 18" dia., Bears N56 0 56'E., 129.6ft., scribed: T108 R36E S26 BT Ponderosa Pine 20" dia., Bears S49 0 36'E., 74.2ft., scribed: T108 R36E S35 BT Ponderosa Pine 22" dia., Bears S19 0 52'W., 169.8ft., scribed: T108 R36E S34 BT Measurements to trees taken with Electronic Tacheometer with bearings turned from the survey control network.

Nailed a brass washer stamped PLS 848 on blaze above BT scribe, Bearing Tree Sign above blaze, and warning sign on back of each tree. Painted a 6" red band at breast ht. around each tree. Set steel fence post with warning Sign, North 3 ft. from the corner.
