CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established in 1881 by Herman D. Gradon, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, under GLO Contract No. 416 dated August 19, 1881. Surveyor General records state:

At the corner position a 3' long by 3" square post was set 24" in the ground, marked 1/4 S on West face from which:
A 20" Pine bears S80°E 27 links marked 1/4 S BT.
A 16" Pine bears N86'W 33 links marked 1/4 S BT.

In 1986 William R. Wells (PLS 1106) was unable to find any evidence of original corner. He re-established corner location by single proportional measurement between the Northeast and Southeast corners of Section 17 and set a 2 1/2" by 30" aluminum pipe with 2 1/2" aluminum cap 24" in the ground, marked as shown in corner diagram, surrounded by mound of earth and a few stones from which: A 12" Western Larch bears N86 1/2"W, 49.6' scribed 1/4 S17 BT. An 11" Ponderosa Pine bears N37 1/2"E, 35.3' scribed 1/4 S16 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fenceposts North and South of corner with 54-9 sign on one and 54-2 signs on both.

Description of corner evidence found:

2 1/2" Aluminum cap 4" above the ground marked as shown in corner diagram from which: 17" Western Larch, with healed blaze, bears N86 1/2'W, 49.6' distance. 14" Ponderosa Pine, with visible scribing, bears N37 1/2'E, 35.3' distance.

Steel fenceposts North and South of corner with 54-9 sign on one and 54-2 signs on both.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Built small stone mound around corner monument.

New bearing trees established:

12" Ponderosa Pine bears S70°E, 46.9' distance, scribed 1/4 S16 BT. 12" Ponderosa Pine bears S33°W, 16.6' distance, scribed 1/4 S17 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 2672 nailed to face of blaze. Attached 54-3 and 54-9signs to each bearing tree and painted face of blaze and a 6" band around each bearing tree. The distance is measured to a 50d nail in side center of bearing trees.

Compass declination 18 East.
