
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was established by William R. Gradon, US Deputy Surveyor, during the original survey Contract No. 409 dated March, 1882.

"Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 ins square 24 ins in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4S on W. face, from which

A pine 20 ins diam. bears N65°E, 10 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S BT. A pine 36 ins diam. bears S20°W, 59 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S BT."



Description of corner evidence found:

Found two root holes that fit record bearing and distance and was near proportionate location.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set 2" aluminum pipe with 3 1/4" aluminum cap, stamped as shown in diagram, 28" in ground, from existing evidence, from which new accessories are:

A 12" Ponderosa Pine, bears N10°30'W, 15.9 ft., scribed "1/4 S27 BT"

A 14" Ponderosa Pine, bears N48°20'E, 12.5 ft., scribed "1/4 S26 BT"

A blue DEEP (Underground Magnetic Locator), bears S48°20'W, 3.5 ft. from corner position, 0.8 ft. in

An orange DEEP, bears \$10°30'E, 2.6 ft. from corner position, 0.9 ft. in ground.
