The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22, and 23, perpetuated by person(s) unknown, monumented with an iron pipe, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., projecting 12 ins. above the ground, with a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of corner, alongside of which is the original basalt stone, $18 \times 10 \times 5$ ins., firmly set 12 ins. in the ground, mkd. with 3 grooves on S. face and 2 grooves on E. face, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:
