

a pine 24 ins dia bears S8°E 22 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT

a pine 18 ins dia bears S20°W 24 lks dist marked 1/4 S BT

SURVEY NO. 10-38-1 DESCRIPTION: Found, B.T. stump for Sec. 14. Set iron post monument with aluminum cap marked as shown.

SURVEY NO. 10-38-2 DESCRIPTION: Found B.T. stump for Sec. 14. Set 1-inch galvanized pipe with 2-inch aluminum cap marked as shown.

SURVEY NO. 10-38-106 DESCRIPTION: Found aluminum cap on steel pipe monument, stamped as shown on the DIAGRAM, as set by James Hanley at record measure from the Section 14 bearing tree, as shown on Baker County Survey No. 10-38-1. No work is needed on monument. From which:

Ponderosa Pine 18" dia., bears N45°15'W., 32.7 ft., Scribed: 1/4 S15 BT

Ponderosa Pine 14" dia., bears N74°15'E., 8.0 ft., Scribed: 1/4 S14 BT

Ponderosa Pine 14" dia., bears N10°02'W., 48.3 ft., Scribed: 1/4 S15 BT

Ponderosa Pine 16" dia., bears N33°36'E., 25.2 ft., Scribed: 1/4 S14 BT

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found 1" galvanized iron pipe with 2 ½" aluminum cap, marked as shown below, projecting 6" above ground, in a 2 ft. diameter mound of stone.

From which, I FOUND A BEARING TREE BY FERGUSON:

► A ponderosa pine, 19" dbh, bears N.49°W., 32.63 ft., with healed blaze


Also from which, I SCRIBE A NEW BEARING TREE:

► A ponderosa pine, 18" dbh, bears N.52°E., 4.93 ft., marked 1/4 S14 in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze

Also from which, I SET NEW REFERENCE POINTS:

- ► A 5/8"x 12" iron pin, driven to failure, bears S.45°07'E., 15.81 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 1 2025 PLS 69454*
- ► A 5/8"x 24" iron pin, driven to failure, bears S.45°16'W., 14.98 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked *RP 2 2025 PLS 69454*

CORNER MONUMENT MARKED:



Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing trees, and also painted the blazes red. Attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs to BT's. Used RTK GPS to measure accessories. Distances to both bearing trees measured to a Mag Spike driven in the side-center-right above the root crown of each tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped PLS 69454. Set a steel fence post West, 5.1 ft., with USFS 54-2 sign attached, and another steel fence post North, 2.2 ft., with USFS 54-2 and 54-9 signs attached.
