In 1974 the Bureau of Land Managment re-monumented this corner from original evidence as follows:

The corner of secs. 14,15,22, and 23, monumented with the original unmarked sandstone, 16x12 x8 ins., loosly set 2" in the ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees; A Fir snag 32" dia. bears N88 E, 79 lks dist., with healed double blaze. (record N85 E) A Ponderosa Pine stump 20" dia. bears S40 E, 100 lks dist., no marks visible.

A " " 36" dia. bears S15 W, 54 lks dist., no marks visible.

A Mountain Mahogony snag 6" dia. bears N35 W, 44 lks dist., with scribe marks R3 visible on open double blaze.

At corner point.

Set an iron post, 28" long  $2\frac{1}{2}"$  dia., 24" in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
