
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT: Corner not previously established.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

None

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER: At position determined by survey, I set a USDA Forest Service 2 ½" x 30" Aluminum pipe, with 3" aluminum cap marked as shown, 27" in the ground, with mound of stone 2 ft. in diameter, from which:



A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears North 89° East, a distance of 49.97 feet, marked NE 1/16 S21 BT. A 9" Ponderosa Pine bears South 8° East, a distance of 36.40 feet, marked NE 1/16 S21 BT.

Set steel fenceposts 4 feet East and South of corner with US Forest Service Property Boundary signs.



I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. I used 18° East declination. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 2219 to the BT blaze. The distance is to a 60d spike driven into the root crown at the right side of the new bearing tree.
