
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Jeff Petersen in Survey Number 11-41-15, as filed in the office of the Baker County Surveyor. Monumentation record states:

Set a 2 ½" x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap, 24 inches in the ground, from which:

- A 15 inch White Fir bears N72°E, 54.25 feet marked C 1/4 S20 BT.
- A 9 inch Douglas Fir bears S23°E, 63.18 feet marked C 1/4 S20 BT.
- A 20 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S29°W, 84.60 feet marked XT BT.
- A 20 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N78°W, 8.19 feet marked C 1/4 S20 BT.



## DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 2 12" aluminum pipe with 2 12" Aluminum cap marked as shown below, set flush with the ground in mound of stone 1.5 ft. diam., from which:

- A 19 inch White Fir bears North 72° East, a distance of 54.25 feet, with visible scribe marks on partially healed blaze.
- A 13 inch Douglas Fir bears South 23° East, a distance of 63.18 feet, with fully healed blaze.
- A 21 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 29° West, a distance of 84.60 feet, with visible scribe marks on partially healed blaze.
- A 22 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 78° West, a distance of 8.19 feet, with visible scribe marks on partially healed blaze.


