

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found Bureau of Land Management 3" Brass cap on 2 ½" iron post, flush with the ground, from

An 18 in. Ponderosa Pine bears North 70° East, a distance of 10.21 feet, with fully healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER: NEW BEARING TREES:

A 12 in. Ponderosa Pine bears South 50° East, a distance of 38.09 feet, marked 1/4 S21 BT. An 8 in. Ponderosa Pine bears South 46° West, a distance of 27.49 feet, marked 1/4 S20 BT. A 17 in. Ponderosa Pine bears North 16° West, a distance of 36.60 feet, marked 1/4 S20 BT.

I place a steel fencepost 1 foot North of the corner monument and attach a Land Survey Monument sign.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. I used 18° East declination. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 2219 to the BT blaze. The distance is to a 60d spike driven into the root crown at the right side of the new bearing trees.
