A 10 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 51° West, a distance of 14.45 feet, marked C1/4 S3 BT. A 6 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 87° West, a distance of 29.50 feet, marked C1/4 S3 BT.

Corner falls on a North facing slope, approximately 7 feet North of an East/West running fenceline, and about 80 feet West of a North/South running fenceline.
