
## **CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION**

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At proportionate position, I set a 1 ½" iron pipe with 2 ½" brass cap, marked as shown below, 23 inches in the ground, in a collar of stone 2 ft. wide, from which:

A 3 inch juniper bears North 63° East, a distance of 17.0 feet, marked X BT. A 5 inch juniper bears South 32° East, a distance of 27.35 feet, marked X BT. A 14 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 11° West, a distance of 23.85 feet, marked 1/4 S3 BT. An 8 inch Juniper bears North 1° West, a distance of 7.9 feet, marked 1/4 S3 BT.


Corner falls on the East side of an old logging road, approximately 100 feet East of a North/South running fence.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. Magnetic declination used was 16° East. Bearings are to a washer in the top of the BT Blaze marked OPLS 83571. Distances are to a 50d spike in the right hand side of the root crown of the tree.
