
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner not previously established. There is evidence that the Bureau of Land Management has used an approximate position, as evidenced by a tag on a high stumped pine marked "FOR BLM USE ONLY, Corner is 25', N74W"



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

None. From position as determined by survey, a high stumped pine with BLM tag (as previously mentioned), bears North 71° East, a distance of 23.0 feet.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position as determined by survey, I set a $5/8" \times 30"$ iron pin, 26 inches in the ground, with 2 $\[\]_{2}"$ aluminum cap, marked as shown below, in a collar of stone, 1 ft. diam., from which:

A 17 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 25° West, a distance of 38.15 feet, marked CS 1/16 S18 BT.

A 12 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 75° West, a distance of 70.40 feet, marked CS 1/16 S18 BT.



I used 16° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the new bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing tree.
