

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position determined by survey, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" iron pin with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap marked as shown below, 12" in the ground, to bedrock, in a mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., from which:

A 11" Ponderosa Pine bears N 86° E, a distance of 53.70 feet, marked CN 1/16 S11 BT.

A 17" Ponderosa Pine bears S 11° W, a distance of 22.10 feet, marked CN 1/16 S11 BT.


Corner falls +/- 11.5 feet South of East/West running barbed wire fence. Set a steel fencepost approximately 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet North of corner monument.

I used 16° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the new bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
