
Originally established by Benjamin F. Vaughn under GLO Contract No. 211, dated July 14, 1874. Surveyor record states:

Corner established at proportionate position by C. Albert White under special instructions dated September 3, 1940, included under Group No. 261. Surveyor record states:

Set an iron post, 28 ins. Long, 2 ½ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground with brass cap. From which:

A yellow pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., 11½ lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S16 BT. A yellow pine, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 86½° W., 30 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S17 BT.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 2 ½" iron pipe with 3" Bureau of Land Management Brass cap, marked as shown below, 1" above the ground. No evidence of bearing trees remains.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER: From the Iron Pipe position,

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 6 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N 46° E, a distance of 8.30 feet, marked 1/4 S16 BT. A 5 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S 73° E, a distance of 11.15 feet, marked 1/4 S16 BT. A 10 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S 30° W, a distance of 17.90 feet, marked 1/4 S17 BT. A 7 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N 50° W, a distance of 9.05 feet, marked 1/4 S17 BT.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 0.5 feet North of corner monument.



A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
