No evidence of the original corner was found. Accepted a old South-East-West fence intersection for the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner, See CS 11-43-7.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the position of the fence corner set a $1\frac{1}{4}$ "x30" galv. pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " dia. brass cap 24" into the ground. The brass cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram.
