

NARRATIVE OF SURVEY

PURPOSE

This survey was performed at the request of Neal Mishler and Coyote Mtn. Ranch, Inc., for the purpose of establishing the boundary between their respective placer mining claims.

METHOD

The placer mining properties are located as subdivisional parts of Section 3, T 12 S R 45 E, W.M. requiring the subdivision of the said section. All government corners required were found to be GLO brass cap monuments which were measured to using proper survey techniques. From these measurements the section was mathematically subdivided in accordance with the statutes of the state of Oregon and the BLM manual of survey instructions. The monuments indicated on the accompanying map were located from survey control points established during the course of the survey. The boundary line was marked with wooden stakes driven in the ground and identified with pink survey flagging.

ORIGINAL SURVEYS

The original GLO survey was performed by George Henderson under contract no. 402 dated July 8, 1881, and Herman D. Graden under contract no. 428 dated Dec. 16, 1881.

A GLO resurvey was performed in 1938 by Otis O. Gould in which the original or relocated corners were set with brass cap monuments.
