
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by E.P.McCornack under GLO contract no.398 dated July 02, 1881.

Surveyor General records state:

Set balalt stone $14 \times 12 \times 7$ ins 10 ins in the ground for 1/4 Sec Cor marked 1/4 on W face and raised a mound of stone alongside.



Description of corner evidence found:

No trace of original marked stone.

Searched 5 hours on 3 separate days and found no trace of corner stone or mound.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At position established by single proportionate distance between adjacent found section corners North and South...

Set $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum pipe with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap 25" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. Cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

New bearing trees established: A ponderosa pine 18" dia bears $S85^{\circ}W$, 17.8' dist marked 1/4S3 BT. A ponderosa pine 16" dia bears $S20^{\circ}E$, 40.7' dist marked 1/4S2 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped PLS 1639 nailed to face of blaze. Attached sign 54-3 & 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" band around each BT. Set steel fence post along-side corner and attached sign 54-9.

Compass declination 190 East.
