

ORIGINAL G.L.O. DESCRIPTION: Set Post 4 ft. long 4 ins. square with marked stone 12 ins in the ground for cor. to Secs 5, 6, 31 + 32 marked T13SS32 on NE, R37E S5 on SE, T14S S6 on SW and S31 on NW faces with 5 notches on E and 1 notch on Edges. Dug pits 18x18x12 ins. in each Sec. 5½ ft. dist and raised a mound of earth 2 ft. high 4½ ft base around post.

**EVIDENCE FOUND:** Found an old rock—jack fence brace containing approximately 20 stones. Near the center of the rock—jack we found a stone measuring 14"X8"X6" set vertically. also found old deteriorated wood fence posts running north and south from this position. after comparing the **EVIDENCE FOUND:** course and distance between this stone and the found monuments to the east and west, I found that this position fit harmoniously with other accepted corners. I accept this stone as the best available evidence of the original corner position.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES SET:

At the corner point I set a 5/8"X30" iron pin with attached 2½" aluminum cap, 28" in the ground. placed stone North alongside. Built a 2 ft. mound of stone around iron pin. Cap is marked as shown below.

FROM WHICH, I SET THE FOLLOWING REFERENCE POINTS: A 5/8"X30" iron pin bears S.47°36'W., 27.36 ft., with attached yellow plastic cap marked BENCHMARK SURVEYING

A 5/8"X30" iron pin bears N.51\*41'W., 20.29 ft., with attached yellow plastic cap marked BENCHMARK SURVEYING

ALSO FROM WHICH, I SCRIBE THE FOLLOWING BEARING TREES: A Ponderosa Pine, 4" DBH, bears N.40°E., 31.4 ft., marked S32

A Ponderosa Pine, 8½" DBH, bears S.64°E., 33.2 ft., marked T14SR37E S5 BT



Used RTK GPS to measure Reference Points and Bearing to Trees. Bearings to RP's and BT's are based on Baker County Survey 13-36-94. Used a steel tape to measure to a 40d nail driven into the side-center of the root crown of BT's. Placed BT tag on Bearing Trees.
