
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner was originally established under GLO contract number 148, dated May 17th, 1871, executed by John S. Kincaid. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set stone 17x10x8 for 1/4 sec. cor.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found an old fence corner from which juniper posts and downed barbed wire run South. In this vicinity I found broken rock with chisel marks "1/". When found pieces were assembled it forms a stone measuring $18" \times 12" \times 10"$.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position of found fence corner I set a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe, 28" in the ground and in a 1 ft. collar of stone, with 3" aluminum cap marked as shown below, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5/8" x 15" iron pin bears North 37°26' East, a distance of 13.01 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER NE RP

A 5/8" x 15" iron pin bears South 45°19' East, a distance of 21.58 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER SE RP


A $5/8" \times 15"$ iron pin bears South $44^\circ03"$ West, a distance of 19.28 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER SW RP

A 5/8" x 15" iron pin bears North 59°01' West, a distance of 15.87 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER NW RP

Buried stone remnants along North side of monument Set steel fence post approx. 1 ft. North
