HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

The subdivisional lines of T13S, R44E were originally surveyed by Herman D. Gradon under General Land Office Contract No. 428, dated December 16,


The field notes for this survey state: Set a flint stone 14x12x4 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for Cor. to Secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, marked with 4 notches on S and 3 notches on E edges. Dug pits 18x18x12 ins. in each Sec. 5 ½ ft. dist. and raised a mound of earth 2 ft. high 4 ½ ft. base alongside.

Oregon State Highway Department Drawing No. 4B-24-11 (Feb., 1935-Rev. Nov., 2000) depicts this corner as "Found" with no additional description.

Baker County Survey No. 13-44-6, recorded July 23, 2003, states: Found Stone (09-07-2002)

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

<u>FOUND:</u> a basalt stone, 14"x12"x4", firmly set 10" in the ground with a small supporting ring of stones, marked with 4 grooves on the S. face and 3 grooves on the E. face. No evidence remains of the original pits or mound of earth.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE **ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:**

At the corner position which I determine to be coincident with the highest physical point of the found stone, I set a 2 1/2" dia. (OD) X 30" aluminum pipe, 28" in the ground, with 3 1/4" dia. aluminum cap, marked as shown. I bury the found stone upside down along the South side of the aluminum pipe.

From which: I establish the following bearing objects:

A 5/8" X 30" iron rod (rebar) with yellow plastic cap marked "APA" set flush with ground bears S88°W, 56.51 ft., (located 2 ft. South of E-W fence line),

A 5/8" X 30" iron rod (rebar) with yellow plastic cap marked "APA" bears S07°E, 150.55 ft. (located 0.8 ft N of existing fence along the

I-84 on-ramp at the Rye Valley Interchange),

A 5/8" X 30" iron rod (rebar) with yellow plastic cap marked "APA" set flush in the ground bears N85°E, 41.40 ft. (located 4 ft. North of an E-W fence line),

And a 5/8" X 30" iron rod (rebar) with yellow plastic cap marked "APA" set flush with ground bears N51°W, 46.10 ft. (located 0.6 ft. East of N-S fence line).

Placed Orange Carsonite post alongside the corner monument. SPCS OREGON NORTH (International Feet-NAD 1983-CORS)
