## History of original corner establishment:

## Description of corner evidence found:

A stone 15x8x7 ins in place with 4 ins projecting out of the ground and marked with 1 notch on S and 2 notches on E edges in small rock mound.

A fir log 10 ins diam bears N  $75^{\circ}$  E, 7 lks dist with full record scribes on open face.

A fir 24 ins diam bears S  $35^{\circ}$  E, 13 lks dist with fully healed blaze. A rotten log bears S  $25^{\circ}$  W, 32 lks dist..no scribes identified.

No trace of other bearing tree.

NOTE: Each original accessory bearing tree has signs 54-3 and 54-4 attached below a 6-inch band of red paint around and placed by others.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position of original stone.. Set  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch aluminum cap on a 2 inch aluminum pipe 30 ins long and buried 25 ins in the ground with 5 ins projecting out of the ground with a surrounding rock mound and a 6-foot steel fence post alongside with a sign 54-9 attached. Buried original stone alongside.

Aluminum cap marked as shown in corner diagram.

New bearing trees established;

A tamarach 9 ins diam bears N 16°E, 14.7 ft dist marked T14SR36ES26BT A alpine fir 8 ins diam bears S 71°W, 10.1 ft dist marked T14SR36ES34BT A alpine fir 8 ins diam bears N 22°W, 6.7 ft dist marked T14SR36ES27BT

Each new bearing tree has a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze and has signs 54-3 and 54-9 attached below a 6-inch band of red paint.
