
## History of original corner establishment:

Corner established by Henry W. Cooke under GLO contract no. 512 dated August 23, 1884.

Surveyor General records state:

Set a basalt stone 16 x 12 x 10 ins, 11 ins in ground for 1/4 sec cor marked 1/4 on W face from which:

A pine 30 ins dia bears  $S60^{O}W$ , 42 lks dist marked 1/4S BT. No other trees within limits and raised a mound of stone alongside.



## Description of corner evidence found:

No trace of original marked stone...corner position falls on fractured rock face. A green pine 36 ins dia bears  $860^{\circ}$ W, 42 lks dist with fully healed face.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position determined by distance intersection from recovered original BT's... Set  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap on 2" aluminum pipe 30" long 12" in ground with 18" proj. out of ground with a 6' steel fence post alongside with sign 54-9 attached. Cap marked as shown.

New bearing trees established:

A pine 9 ins dia bears  $S27^{\circ}E$ , 26.1 ft dist marked 1/4S12 BT and a brass washer marked PLS 1639 nailed flush with BT blaze.

Both new and original bearing trees have signs 54-3 and 54-4 or 54-9 attached below a band of red paint.
