ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, with brass cap marked (diagram shown) from which

A white fir, 8 ins. dia., bears N. 18° E., 83 lks. dist., marked T 8 S R 37 E S 28 BT.

A Douglas-fir, 5 ins. dia., bears S. 67° E., 112 lks. dist., marked T 8 S R 37 E S 33 BT.

A quaking asp, 7 ins. dia., bears S. 48° W., 74 lks. dist., marked T 8 S R 37 E S 32 BT.

A yellow pine, 42 ins. dia., bears N.16 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 46 lks. dist., marked T 8 S R 37 E S 29 BT.

HANLEY'S DESCRIPTION: A brass cap of record dimensions and markings as shown in corner diagram.

A ponderosa pine 45 ins dia bears N 16½°W, 46 lks with scribes visible.

A douglas fir 24 ins dia bears S67°E, 112 lks with healed blaze.

A white fir 17 ins dia bears N18°E, 83 lks with healed blaze.

No sign of the aspen.

Improved surrounding rock mound around recovered corner monument and set a 6 foot steel fence post alongside with a sign 54-9 attached.

New bearing tree established:

A douglas fir 11 ins dia bears S21°W, 43.6 ft marked T8SR37ES32BT.

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found 2" iron pipe with 2 ½" brass cap, marked as shown below, projecting 16" above ground in a 2.5 ft. diameter mound of stone, with a steel fence post with attached USFS 54-9 sign set Northwest, 3.5 ft. from monument.

- ➤ A white fir, 23" dbh, bears N.18°E., 54.8 ft. (GLO BT).
- ► A Douglas-fir, 30" dbh , bears S.67°E., 73.9 ft., with healed double blazes (GLO BT).
- ► A Douglas-fir, 23" dbh, bears S.21°W., 43.6 ft., with healed double blazes (Hanley BT).
- ► A ponderosa pine, 44" dbh, N.16 ½ °W., 30.4 ft., with visible scribing in a partially healed blaze (GLO BT).
