ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: A pine post 4 ft. long, 4 ins square, set 18 ins in the ground, surrounded with a mound of earth, scribed Golden Gate-4-514 Identical with location S.W. cor. post. From which

A pine 18 ins in diam, bears N81°40'E 20.5 ft. dist. blazed & scribed Golden Gate 4-514-B.T. A fir 8 ins in diam, bears N69°W 20 ft. dist. blazed and scribed Golden Gate-4-514-B.T.

DESCRIBE CORNER MONUMENT FOUND: Rotted post in md of stone & earth
DESCRIBE BEARING TREES OR OTHER OFFICIAL ACCESSORIES FOUND: 34" gr. pp brs N85°E 19' w/ scribing in p. opened blaze.

MONUMENT: DESCRIBE NEW MONUMENT SET, OR WORK DONE TO PRESERVE EXISTING MONUMENT: $2\frac{1}{2}$ " B.C. on 1"x32" gal. pipe set 24" deep in md of earth & stone marked GG C4 MS 514 JRM 1981 & Angle.

EVIDENCE: 12" DF brs S60°W 7'

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found Mitchell's unrecorded monument, which is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap marked as shown below, projecting 12" above ground in a 2 ft. diam. mound of stone From which, I found the original NE bearing tree, which is a dead and down (wind thrown) ponderosa pine, 30"+ dbh, with overgrowth that had been chopped out to reveal part of a blaze with scribing *NGATE-4-514-BT* visible. The center of the rootwad hole bears N.84°E., 19ft.±

Also from which, Mitchell's bearing trees:

- ► A Douglas-fir, 19" dbh, bears S.60°W., 7.30 ft., with fully healed single blaze.
- ▶ A white fir snag, 11" dbh, bears N.64°W., 10 ft., with fully healed single blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept the found brass-capped monument as the best available evidence of the original corner. Cap is marked as shown.

From which, I SCRIBE A NEW BEARING TREE:

► A ponderosa pine, 6" dbh, bears S.78°39'E., 56.19 ft. marked X in upper blaze, and BT in lower blaze.

Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing trees, painted the blazes red, and attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Used RTK GPS to measure accessories. Distances to live bearing trees were measured to a 60d nail driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of each tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped PLS 69454. Set aluminum post S.50°E., with USFS sign 54-2 and set another one N.46°E., with USFS signs 54-2 and 54-9 attached.
